If you plan to retake a test, try to do it by the December date at the latest. Technical schools do not require the ACT, but offer the COMPASS, ACCUPLACER, or another placement test for entry into their programs.

This may be scheduled in November and/or February. More information will be forthcoming. You and your parents will need to attend this meeting. It is best if your parents have started filling out the financial aid application before attending the meeting. They can then ask questions at the meeting. 24. Submit your completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to the processor as early as possible. Try to get them submitted in January. Submit FAFSA **no later** than March 1. You file a FAFSA over the Internet at http://www.fafsa.ed.gov. Get your PIN number early at www.pin.ed.gov. 25. KEEP COPIES OF ALL FAFSA and TAX FORMS YOU SUBMIT. 26. PARENTS. Schools may request to see your tax returns to verify your FAFSA. Be sure to make copies of your tax forms. \_27. Request fall semester transcript be sent from the counselor if your postsecondary institution requires it. 28. Attend Legislative Page session, if you have been selected for session 1 or 2. 29. Utilize fastweb.com, scholarships.com, and other free scholarship search sites. Do not pay money for scholarship searches or fall victim to come-ons to meet somewhere to learn about how to receive scholarship dollars. Use the information and applications we provide and do free web searches. Scholarship information is available on the school website/counselor link or you can stop by the counselor's office. **FEBRUARY** 30. Make final decision regarding the post-secondary institution you wish to attend. Notify the institutions of your decision. 31. After you have applied for Financial Aid, you will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR). Look for Pell Grant information in your SAR. The SAR must be sent to the school that you will be attending before the school will develop a financial aid package for you. 32. Continue to complete and send scholarship applications. MARCH 33. Apply for Financial Aid **no later** than March 1 to meet priority deadlines. \_34. Make housing arrangements at the institution you will be attending. 35. Make college visits if you have not done so. \_36. If you have not received your SAR within four weeks after sending your FAFSA, contact the

Federal Student Aid Information Center at (301) 722-9200 and inquire about the status of your

application.
